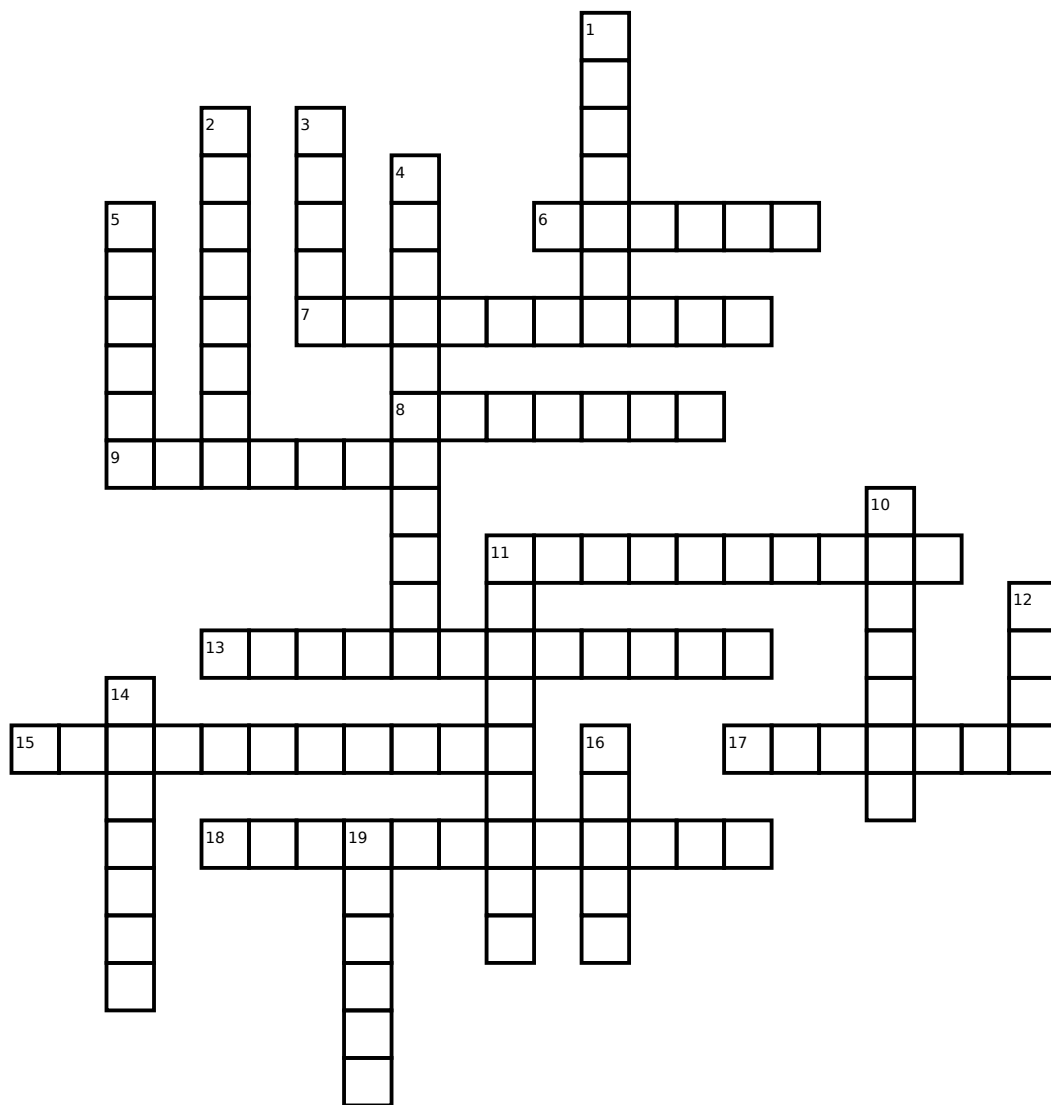


CROSSWORD #11
